> DOMAINS OF APPLICATION

Specialised dictionaries, technical documentation, corporate vocabularies, translation, multilingualism, human resources, business repositories, information management, knowledge capitalisation and management, semantic web, digital humanities...

> PROGRAMME

- The **112-hour course** consists of 2 blocks of compulsory skills, 1 basic block and a block of optional specialisation.
- The course will take place online from January to June.
- The language of instruction is French or English, depending on participants.

> RYTHM

The course can be completed over 1 or 2 years with the option of following With the option of studying a block of choice and/or capitalising on the blocks and finishing the DU over a maximum of 2 years.

> HOW TO OBTAIN IT

- An assessment takes place at the end of each block.
- A final evaluation will take the form of a written report in French or English and an oral defence. The award of the diploma is subject to :
 - Full attendance of the course programme.
 - An overall average of at least 10/20.

BASIC BLOCK : FOUNDATIONS AND METHODS OF TERMINOLOGY (52.5 hours)

> PRESENTATION

The aim of this module is to master the foundations, methods and tools needed for terminology work in a context where digital technology is becoming increasingly important. This module will address how to analyse corpora for terminological purposes and how to represent conceptual systems in order to identify criteria which help in the drafting of terminological definitions.

> OBJECTIVES

- Understand the theoretical and methodological foundations of terminology in the digital age.
- Familiarisation with computer tools for terminology work.
- Know how to write «good» definitions adapted to terminological needs.
- Understand the role of norms and standards in terminology work.

> TARGET AUDIENCE

Anyone, professional, academic or otherwise, interested in the latest advances in terminology work.

> CONTENTS

- **Principles and methods of terminology :**
 - Term, relationships between terms.
 - The role of terminology in international institutions.
- **Tool-based analyses of text corpora :**
 - Contexts.
 - Contextual definitions.
- **Construction of conceptual systems :**

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SPECIALISATION BLOCK : TERMINOLOGY APPLIED TO TRANSLATION IN A PROFESSIONAL CONTEXT

(52.5 hours)

> PRESENTATION

This module aims to lay the foundations for a contemporary approach to terminology related to the use of corpora in order to demonstrate the methods and tools applied to translation. Content is illustrated using professional contexts.

It further aims to present the whole of the terminology activities carried out within the European institutions, not only in the translation of legislative texts but also in other contexts (for example, subtitling, communication, media).

> OBJECTIVES

- Understand how terminology concepts are applied in translation.
- Understand how terminology is used in professional contexts.
- Learn how to use terminology resources (WIPO Pearl, IATE).

> TARGET AUDIENCE

Translators, interpreters, language teachers, linguists, company and public service executives.

> CONTENTS

- **Introduction to basic terminology concepts and corpus-based terminography in the context of translation.**
- **Presentation and handling of corpus-based terminology analysis tools.**
- **Practical professional training for the process of enriching a terminology database : WIPO Pearl.**
- **Research and use of terminology resources, European Union terminology : IATE and other databases.**
- **Terminological work for translation within the European institutions :** Methods of inter-institutional and academic cooperation (projects for IATE, projects of the «Terminology without Borders» project).



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SPECIALISATION BLOCK : TERMINOLOGY IN THE DIGITAL AGE (52.5 hours)

> PRESENTATION

Information processing applications are increasingly based on terminology resources that must be made available in digital form.

This requires that terms and concepts are represented in computer-friendly formats, taking into account the relevant norms and standards. Such a representation is based on specific methods and software environments, which require terminology work to be adapted accordingly.

> OBJECTIVES

- Understand the challenges and opportunities of digital technology for terminology.
- Master methods and IT tools for the construction of terminologies.
- Master the exchange formats and representation standards.
- Know how to construct multilingual terminology in a digital format by following a methodological approach.

> TARGET AUDIENCE

Terminologists, translators, technical writers, anyone wishing to acquire the minimum competencies needed for the construction of terminologies in a format that allows them to be exchanged and processed electronically.

Access to online forms

Adobe Acrobat Reader must be integrated into your web browser to allow you to complete the forms online.

Users may sometimes have difficulties printing or even opening online forms. If this is the case, try saving the form to your hard drive (select «Save As» or «Save Link As» by right-clicking while hovering on the hyperlink to the desired form) and then opening and completing the form locally using Adobe Acrobat Reader.

Fill in the form

Open the form using Adobe Acrobat Reader or Adobe Acrobat. Acrobat Reader will allow you to fill in, print, save and send the completed form by e-mail.

Once the form is open, left-click on a field and insert your text. Once you have entered your information, click outside the field you have just filled out or press the «tab» key to go to the next field. To tick the boxes, simply click on the box, which will fill it with an «X». To remove the «X», click on the box again.

Once the form has been filled in, make sure that all text is visible in the printed document. Inserting paragraph returns with the «enter» key may cause the text to move outside of the available space, causing it to disappear from the form. To check that the contents of a field are visible, simply press the «tab» key or click somewhere outside the field. If the inserted text is not visible, try deleting some paragraph returns or re-inserting the text.
